### **MAFCA** Information

Your Board of Directors met on August 24 and I am pleased to report things are going well. The Board meets 4 or 5 times a year and conducts business via email and telephone the rest of the time. The two new Board members for 2014 – **Happy Begg** and **Jim Cannon** were ratified. They will be great additions and bring fresh perspective to MAFCA.

We finished the year with 13,643 family memberships. This is down about 133 from 2012, but up from 2008. Interestingly we have 48 new members since August 1 and all of them from the internet. MAFCA now has a <u>Facebook page</u> and we are attracting a lot of interest. It is a place to share pictures, tell Model A stories, and connect with others in the hobby.

As you know, we had exactly the same number of candidates for the Board as openings so there was no election this year. Being on the MAFCA Board is a challenging a fun opportunity and if you have any interest in running for the Board next year would be a good time. There is some <u>basic information on our website</u>. While being on the Board is fun as you get to meet hundreds of people interested in the Model A Ford from all over the country and around the world, it is also work. Each Director spends about 20 hours a week in support of MAFCA. Communicating with almost 14,000 members, 300 chapters, and a large number of vendors, printers, and employees takes time. We are always seeking good people who love the Model A Ford and who have some business background to help manage MAFCA. I would not trade my time on the Board for any other volunteer opportunity.

Hershey is coming up soon. If you go, please stop by the MAFCA tent and say hello. This year, our Technical Director Chuck Christensen will be presenting a seminar on the Model A Water Pump. #### Technical Notes

#### Technical Tip Anti-seize Lubricant

Anti-seize is a special type of lubricant, and should not be used as a sealer or threadlock. It will withstand high pressure and high heat. The main purpose is to prevent metal parts from becoming "cold welded" together. This is also known as galling, carbon fusion, seizure, and corrosion. Continuous high heat or similar metals can cause cold welded. Examples on a Model A are the head bolt studs, exhaust manifold studs, and water pump studs that are attached to the block. Also, all of the fasteners used on the exhaust system. If a person uses stainless steel nuts and bolts these have a tendency to cold weld themselves together making removal almost impossible without breakage. Steel on steel with the presents of rust over the years can seize parts together.

If anti-seize lubricant is placed on the threads during assembly, this will prevent, "cold welding" and make disassembly easier.
















#### Community Service
